

## Summer League Rules 2010.

1. Each team to consist of 2 players. Each player plays 2 singles and one doubles match.[A third player can be used for the Doubles.]
2. Each match is best of 3 sets,
3. Each set won is worth one league point.
4. Each player has a handicap allocated by the organising committee. This handicap can be changed during the Summer League season at the discretion of the organising committee. All handicaps will be reviewed after the first 3 or 4 matches of the season.
5. Each set is normally played up to 25 points when both players have a zero or plus handicap.
6. Each player has 5 serves in a row.
7. If a set is level at 24 points each the next point wins. You do not have to get 2 points in front to win the set.
8. Division 1 players with a minus handicap play their sets up to 25 plus their handicap so if a player has a handicap of minus 2 the set goes up to 27 or if minus 6 the set goes up to 31 etc.
9. A player with a minus handicap playing a player with a plus handicap means the plus handicap player starts with the minus handicap of his opponent added to his score so if player A has a minus 4 handicap and player B has a plus 9 handicap player B starts the set 13 zero [ minus 4 plus 9 ] in front and each set is played up to 29 points [ 25 plus minus 4 ].
10. In the Doubles the handicap is decided by adding the 2 players handicap together and then dividing it in half e.g. if player A has a handicap of minus 2 and his partner player B has a handicap of plus 8 [ minus 2 plus 8 = 6 divided by 2 = 3 as the pairs handicap.] or if player A has a handicap of minus 2 and player B has a handicap of plus 13 [ minus 2 plus 13 = 11 divided by 2 = 5 and a half which is rounded up to 6 as the pairs handicap ]. Remember half numbers always go up to work out the handicap.[ The handicap is the mid point between the 2 numbers added together eg -2 -1 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 so 3 is the mid point and the pair's handicap.]
11. Please fill in all result cards clearly and leave them in the box at the end of the game or give them to one of the organising committee if they are present that evening.
12. Both team captains must sign the completed result card to verify the final score.
13. Unless otherwise agreed both teams should share as equally as possible the cost of lighting.
14. Eight teams will go through to the Quarter Finals. This will be the top two teams from each night's league if , like last year, we have 4 leagues on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. If we only have 3 leagues the top 2 from each night's league plus the two best third place teams will go through to the Quarter Finals. This will be finalised when we know exactly how many teams have entered.

15. Every effort must be made to play games on the scheduled evening. In an emergency a team may 'borrow' a player from another team and that player uses their own handicap when playing for a different team. No player may play more than twice for another team.
16. A game can only be rearranged on another evening with the agreement of both captains and the Summer League Committee who must be informed as soon as possible of any rearrangements.
17. If a team fails to turn up for a scheduled match without notifying their opponents they concede that game 10-0 unless the organising committee decide otherwise. An unexpected emergency stopping a team playing for example could lead the committee to decide the game should be played later but this would only happen in extreme cases.
18. Five pound entry fees must be paid by the end of May 2010 to any of the Summer League Committee members. Teams who have not paid by the stated date run the risk of being deducted points as a first sanction and then excluded from the League if payment is still not made.
19. Matches should start at 7. 30 pm.
20. Tokens for the lights should be collected from the same ITTA members as in the Winter League and Captains should be responsible for having the required tokens.

As always play competitively and do your best to win but also play sportingly and respect your opponents in the game you are playing and show proper consideration for people playing on any other tables so that everybody can enjoy the Summer League in 2010.

## **Summer Competition Final**

Kelly's Heroes have retained their Summer Competition title, after an epic battle against fellow finalists Barking George on Tuesday night.

It was Barking George though who got off to the perfect start, with Ian Barker comfortably defeating Danny Lansdown in straight sets, 29-7 29-11 to give the Barkers an early 2-0 lead. Barker controlled the game from start to finish, pushing Lansdown around the table on a regular basis, and showed he will certainly be a match for his Division Two counterparts next season.

Then came the game of the evening, with youngster James Barker taking on the experienced Trevor Kelly. Despite the divisional gap between the pair, the standard of the game was extremely high, with Barker at times matching Kelly hit for hit. With Kelly chasing him down, Barker stuck to his game plan, not afraid to take on Kelly with his own attacking shots, and it so nearly paid off. Consistency proved to be the key, with Kelly landing his attacking shots on a more regular basis than Barker. Kelly scraped home after a marathon battle containing 145 points, 32-35 35-34 35-28.

James Barker was soon wishing his side had won the toss for choice of home or away, as he was next on, facing Danny Lansdown. After such an effort just minutes earlier, Lansdown took advantage of an exhausted Barker, defeating him in straight sets 29-25 29-22.

It was then the turn of the two form players of the night, Ian Barker and Trevor Kelly. With the score currently standing at 4-3 to the Heroes, Barker knew he needed to get something out of the tie to keep his side in the game, and he did just that. With Kelly still recovering from his first match, it took him a while to get into the game, and Barker took full advantage by taking the first end 35-27. Kelly managed to make more of a game of the second end, but still couldn't quite find the form that defeated Barker Junior, as Barker Senior secured the second end 35-30.

With just the doubles to play, it was the finish that everyone wanted. With the Barkers leading 5-4, Kelly and Lansdown needed to pull a great performance out of the bag to snatch victory, but with the handicap heavily on the Barker's side, it looked unlikely. However, a positive start from the Division One pair saw the handicap vanish within minutes, and the tables had turned. With the scores level, Kelly's Heroes looked to push on, but having relaxed, the Barkers looked to punished them. They kept hold of Kelly and Lansdown throughout, not letting them get away. At 30-30, the Barkers were just two points from victory, but Kelly and Lansdown had other ideas, securing the two points they needed to level up the scores, and leave the Barkers needing to win the next end to remain in the game. The second end went much the same way, with a positive start wiping out the handicap, but the Barkers battled on, matching the Division One pair hit for hit. Once again, the score line read 30-30, and history repeated itself, with the Heroes claiming the next two points to take the end 32-30, and winning the match in the process 6-5.

Credit must go to both teams for playing out a final of such high quality, but special congratulations to Danny Lansdown and Trevor Kelly, who have retained the Summer Competition, and will again be the pair to beat when the summer of 2011 comes around.
